Funding towards an additional KS2 teacher	Approximately £20,000	An additional class meaning smaller class sizes and pure year groups will be more manageable for teachers and extremely beneficial to all Key Stage 2 pupils, including Pupil Premium pupils.
Part funding of a Teaching Assistant /HLTA deployed to work in the Year 6 class	Approximately £10,000	To ensure that the Year 6 pupils achieve good or better progress, including Pupil Premium pupils.
Mathematics 1 to 1 tuition for Key Stage 2 pupils – one morning per week (Y6 in Autumn 2013 and Spring 2014 and Y5 in Summer 2014, with a focus on Pupil Premium pupils)	Approximately £2,500	To give our most vulnerable Year 6 pupils support in achieving Level 4 in Mathematics. To prepare our most vulnerable Year 5 pupils for Year 6.
Learning Mentor – Part funding of this role, supporting the more vulnerable pupils individually, in groups and in class, including Pupil Premium Pupils	Approximately £8,000	Support for our most vulnerable pupils in school when coping with challenging situations both at school and at home, and in and out of class, therefore helping to raise self-esteem and motivation and having a positive impact on learning.
Work with Qdos Dance Theatre on the theme of 'Raising Aspirations'.	Approximately £2,000	Autumn term project, including a performance at a venue outside of school, to increase the motivation of pupils in Year 5, in preparation for a successful journey at the beginning of Upper Key Stage 2.
Employ an additional teacher for one afternoon per week to support the teaching of phonics in Key Stage 1 (Years	Approximately £2,200	Year 1 pupils to pass the Phonics Screening in June 2014. Applicable Year 2 pupils to

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This year, due to the increase in Pupil Premium funding by the Government and because South Hiendley J I & EY School has a higher percentage of Free School Meals pupils than the National Average figure, we have received a significant amount of additional funding. Therefore, decisions about Pupil Premium spending for 2013-2014 have been made based on what actions will have the biggest impact on narrowing the gap and raising attainment for our most vulnerable pupils in school. This action plan corresponds with the 2013-2014 School Development Plan and will be monitored and reviewed by Senior Leaders and the Governing Body throughout the year.
